<p>MACKENZIE ASTLEY <i>Chef, Wharton House</i></p> <p>Optional player</p>	<p>Mackenzie Astley is the head chef at the Wharton House. The food is <i>to die for</i> at the club, and Mackenzie is solely responsible. Mackenzie honed excellent culinary skills under the top chefs in the world and was recruited by Xavier Waldorf after tasting a dish Mackenzie made for an intimate party for Bony Records executives. Mackenzie is known to speak slowly and often uses the grating catchphrase: <i>I don't think we're in Kansas anymore</i>. Mac is overly polite but sometimes laughs at inappropriate times – which can appear rude.</p>	<p>Both male and female: chef costume</p>
<p>SKYE DRUMMOND <i>Landscaper, Wharton House</i></p> <p>Optional player</p>	<p>Skye Drummond is the landscaper of the Wharton House. Skye pays close attention to detail, and not a blade of grass is out of place on the club's three lawns. The flower garden is full of exotic flowers, and there is no browned spot on the petals to be seen. Skye overuses their hands while speaking as if Skye doesn't know what to do with him, and randomly scratches their head. If Skye can't think of the right word that fits in a sentence, they will replace the word with an exaggerated grunt. You must learn to decipher context clues when speaking with Skye, or you might get confused.</p>	<p>Both male and female: Casual attire with foliage sticking out from everywhere, as you've been working in the garden</p>
<p>SLOANE BUXTON <i>Assistant to Mr. Cavendish</i></p> <p>Optional player</p>	<p>Sloane Buxton works at the Wharton House as the assistant to Mr. Cavendish. Sloane's job is to ensure that Alcott's experience is top-notch and stress-free while at the club from the moment his car drives up to the valet stand until he climbs back in the car. No drop of rain must fall on Alcott's shoulders, and he should want for nothing while on the premises. Because of Sloane's duties, Sloane is critical of everything. Sloane gets distracted easily, which has led to mishaps, such as Alcott not getting his snack on time or waiting for a phone charger for too long. Sloane's accent changes over time, which is peculiar.</p>	<p>Both male and female: Tuxedo or black suit.</p>

<p>RORY STANHOPE <i>Mr. Archibald's Chauffeur</i></p> <p>Optional player</p>	<p>Rory Stanhope works for the Wharton House as Mr. Vincent Archibald's chauffeur. When Vincent wishes to come to the club, Rory must pick up Vincent from wherever he is – even if he's out of town. Rory must also take Vincent anywhere he wants to go when he is ready to leave the club. The three owners of the Wharton house all have chauffeurs and assistants assigned to them. Rory blinks very slowly and yawns frequently. Rory will snap their fingers between sentences while they speak and babbles to themselves on occasion. Rory claims that chatting to oneself is a sign of intelligence. Nobody has checked that 'fact' to date.</p>	<p>Both male and female: Chauffeur costume. (Black suit and chauffer's hat).</p>
<p>YARDLEY BLACKWOOD <i>Housekeeper, Wharton House</i></p> <p>Optional player</p>	<p>Yardley Blackwood works as the Wharton House head housekeeper. Yardley is demanding and vigilant when it comes to the club being impeccable. The marble floors are shined, wooden floors are oiled, and not a speck of dust can be found. Yardley is bad about rolling their eyes when someone says something uncouth or thoughtless, and this housekeeper needs to acknowledge everyone. Maybe Yardley addresses everyone to subconsciously let them know they will be accountable for making messes while in the club? Yardley is not a trusting soul and is openly suspicious of anyone who speaks more than they should.</p>	<p>Both male and female: housekeeping uniform or black tuxedo</p>
